Dear Fremont Ross Families and Students,

As we now have moved into the second semester of the school year, it is expected that Fremont Ross will continue to grow from what we have learned in the first semester, and strive to be better as a student body with improved school pride.

First, our winter sports have had some new changes. The Ross bowling team has changed from a club sport to an OHSAA sanctioned team. Our Lady Giants wrestling team is also now sanctioned with OHSAA, and we hosted our first girls' wrestling invitational tournament. This is also our final year in the Three Rivers Athletic Conference (TRAC). Next year we will be in the Northern Lakes League (NLL). Please come out to support these teams as well as our girls' and boys' basketball teams, our swim teams, our wrestling teams and cheerleading.

Second, please continue to be an influential force with our school and your child's educational pathway to graduation. Encourage your child to attend school regularly, seek academic assistance from teachers and counselors, and always put forth their best effort. Students will begin registering for classes for their 2023–24 school schedule at the beginning of February. The counselors will be conducting their annual presentations regarding the course offerings for the 2023–24 school year. All scheduling will be completed online. All student athletes who are working towards continuing their athletic career in college must be scheduling NCAA approved classes. Encourage your athletes to ask their counselor any questions about these classes.

Third, state testing season is beginning in February. Juniors will take the ACT exam on Tuesday, February 28th. This is a regular school day for all students. End of Course exams will begin in April, after Spring Break. It is imperative for graduation requirements that students complete with the best of their ability all End of Course exams for which they are scheduled. There is more information about testing in this newsletter.

Senior graduation information was shared with seniors on January 17th. If a senior missed this meeting, please encourage them to contact Ms. Huth, their school counselor, or Ms. Robinson, their grade level principal. Please make sure you talk to your child about this information. It is critical that deadlines are met in order to facilitate a smooth graduation process. All seniors must have a signed graduation contract on file with the Main Office in order to participate in the commencement ceremony.

Finally, each day provides an opportunity for every student to improve and make themselves better. Our Fremont Ross community is growing strong, and we appreciate the enthusiasm and support from our students, staff and community.

MANDATORY STATE TESTING UPCOMING

MANDATORY ACT TEST FOR ALL JUNIORS – FEBRUARY 28, 2023

MANDATORY ACT TESTING FOR ALL JUNIORS - FEBRUARY 28, 2023. On Tuesday, February 28, 2023, the state-funded ACT testing will take place at Ross for students in the Junior class. This opportunity allows all juniors to take the ACT free of charge.

The school day will remain a regular school day for all students in other grades. As juniors finish with their ACT testing, they will be sent back to class to follow their regular schedule. All juniors will receive lunch, though it may not be during their scheduled lunch period.

Before the exam ...

On a date before the testing, all Juniors must complete the ACT Prep for Testing forms. Students attending Ross will complete this in their English/Language Arts 11 class. If you are a Junior at Vanguard, Ross administration will come to Vanguard and you will complete the forms at Vanguard. If you are a CCP student, (without an ELA 11 class at Ross) you will need to come to Ross to complete these forms. These forms must be completed prior to taking the ACT. It usually takes each student 60-75 minutes to complete! CCP students, watch your school email for the dates to come to Ross to complete these forms!

ATTENTION Families of Class of 2024 - Immunization Requirement for 12th Grade

The Ohio Department of Health is requiring all students entering 12th grade to be vaccinated against meningococcal disease. The students are required to have the MCV4 immunization prior to the first day of 12th grade.

Please contact the Sandusky County Heath Department at 419.334.6367 or your family physician to schedule an appointment. Consider making your child's appointment soon because summer appointments are in demand and sometimes unavailable. According to the Ohio Revised Code, students not in compliance with the immunization requirements are to be excluded from school attendance no later than the 15th day after the start of school.

Please provide documentation to the school nurse as soon as possible after your child receives the required immunization.

ABSENCES, TRUANCIES, and OFF SCHEDULE

We firmly believe that your child's attendance and proper behavior is critical to their classroom success and their graduation pathway. Resources are available at Fremont Ross to support your child in most situations. Please encourage your child to reach out to their grade level counselor fo learn about these resources.

Students marked as excessively absent, truant, or off-schedule will be scheduled for intervention meetings with Mr. Jason Smith, our Attendance Coordinator and the grade level principal and counselor to create a plan that will assist your child in their school attendance.

Excessive absences, truancies, and off-schedules will impact a students ability to attend the Fremont Ross Prom on Saturday, May 6, 2023. Students who have accumulated six (6) or more unexcused absences, three (3) truancy/off-schedule incidents or seven (7) or more tardiness violations during the time period between the start of the second semester and the Thursday before prom tickets go on sale, will be excluded from attending the prom.

Students who have violated the student code of conduct, resulting in out of school suspension days in excess of three (3), are ineligible to participate in prom.

ACE Mentoring Program (Assisting Children to Excel)

The ACE Mentoring Program kicked off the second semester with bright ideas for the future. ACE matches students at FMS and Ross with local community members to provide them with a mentor for emotional and academic support. Students and mentors usually meet together weekly/bi-weekly in person during a study hall or non-core class. Each session provides mentees with study skills, college preparation and career readiness.

Students are matched by personal interests and career aspirations and our mentors come from many professions and careers. This gives students another opportunity to receive encouragement and help them make career choices. Many students increased their grades and attendance and were on the honor roll. For the 2022-2023 school year, 26 students from Ross are involved in the ACE Mentoring Program.
